STRATEGIC OVERVIEW

I. Mission Statement

- To empower young people and instil a culture of individual excellence and encourage solidarity among Mauritians
- To foster a culture of community sport, physical and recreational activities for a healthy nation
- To create an amateur to elite sport environment and promote excellence in sports for Mauritian athletes to shine internationally
- To develop a vibrant and growing Sport Economy

II. Current Situation & Challenges

Youth Empowerment

- Out of the 22 Youth Centres that carry out diverse activities in youth empowerment, 9 have been revamped into Youth Hubs and 13 are in the process.
- From July 2023 to March 2024, around 70,000 youths participated in the various youth programmes including National Youth Civic Service, Duke of Edinburgh's Award, Youth Entrepreneurship, Youth Leadership Training Life Skills and Service d'écoute, and Smart Youth and Volunteer Mauritius Programmes.
- As at April 2024, 10 international events and 4 major events/concerts were held at the Cote d'Or National Sports Complex.
- Some 1,040 members have registered for gym/swimming pool membership at the Cote d'Or National Sports Complex.
- As at May 2024, 8 activities of national interest were held in line with the National Sports and Physical Activity Policy.

Sports

- As at May 2024, 142 elite athletes comprising 89 men and 53 women are benefitting from the High-Level Sports Assistance Scheme.
- For the period July 2023 to May 2024, 210 young athletes comprising 121 boys and 89 girls were obtaining support from the Trust Fund for Excellence in Sports to combine elite sports and education.
- 24 elite athletes comprising 14 men and 10 women were benefitting from support under "Horizon Olympique et Paralympique des Athletes Elites" (HOPE) to prepare for the Olympic and Paralympic Games 2024 in Paris as at May 2024.
- Mauritius will participate in various regional and international sports competitions/ games in 2024-2025 including the Olympic Games and Paralympic Games in Paris.
- The Mauritius Sports Council is currently managing 30 sports facilities comprising 9 stadiums, 5 swimming pools, 4 outdoor complexes, 2 sports complexes and 10 gymnasiums.

- From July 2023 to April 2024, around 220,818 persons participated in the programmes held under Active Mauritius (LAMPS ¹, Youth on the Move, Elderly Fitness and Sports Medicine).
